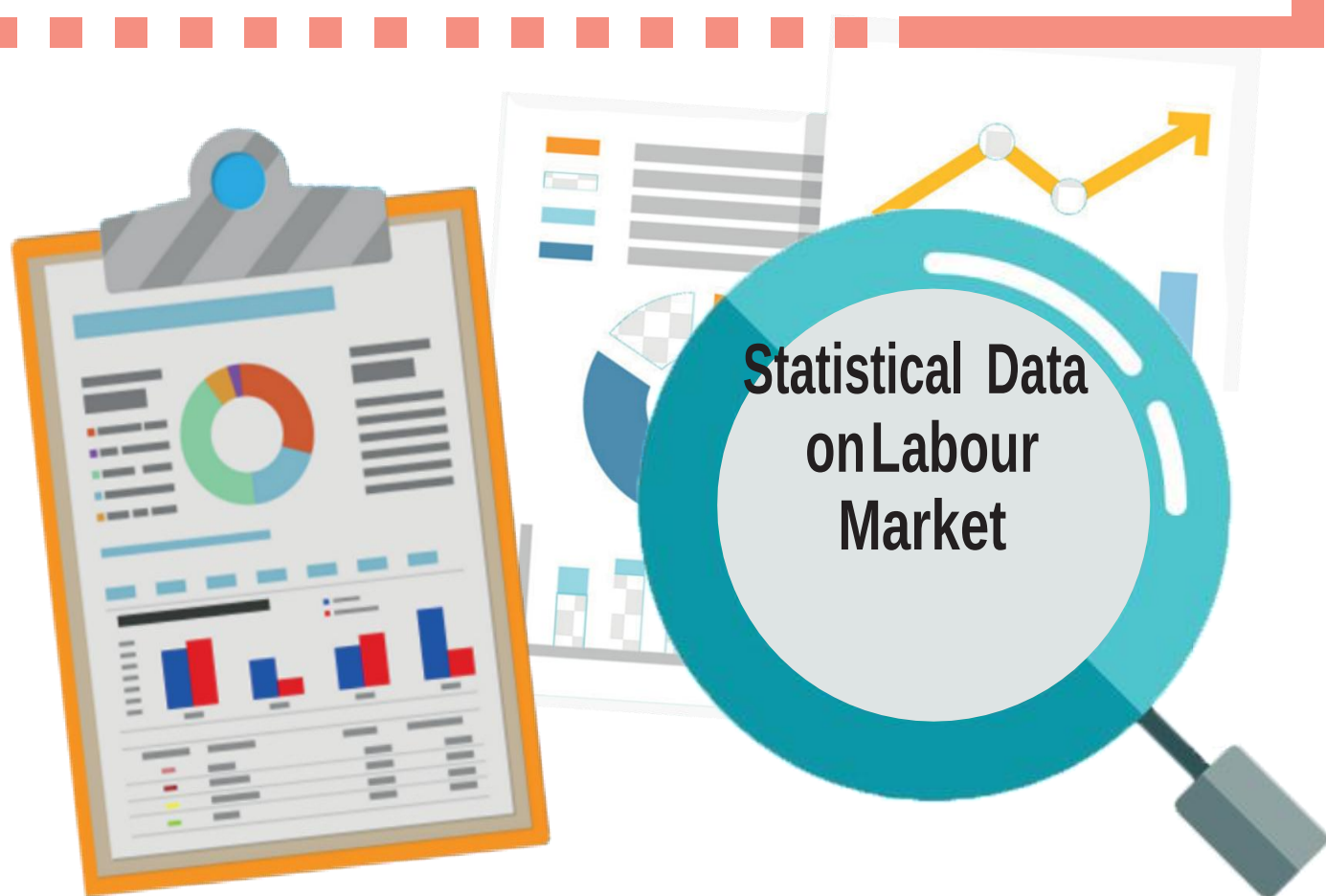

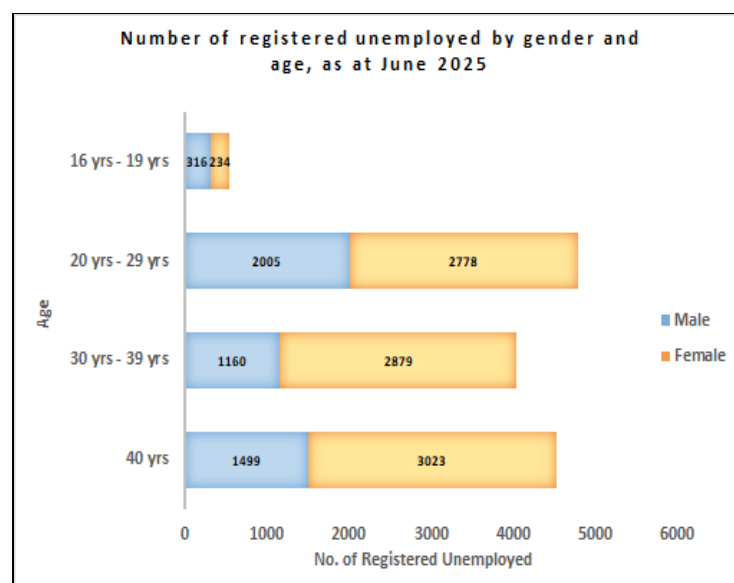

34,428 jobseekers seeking employment including (13,894) as unemployed or a better job (20,534) as at end of June 2025



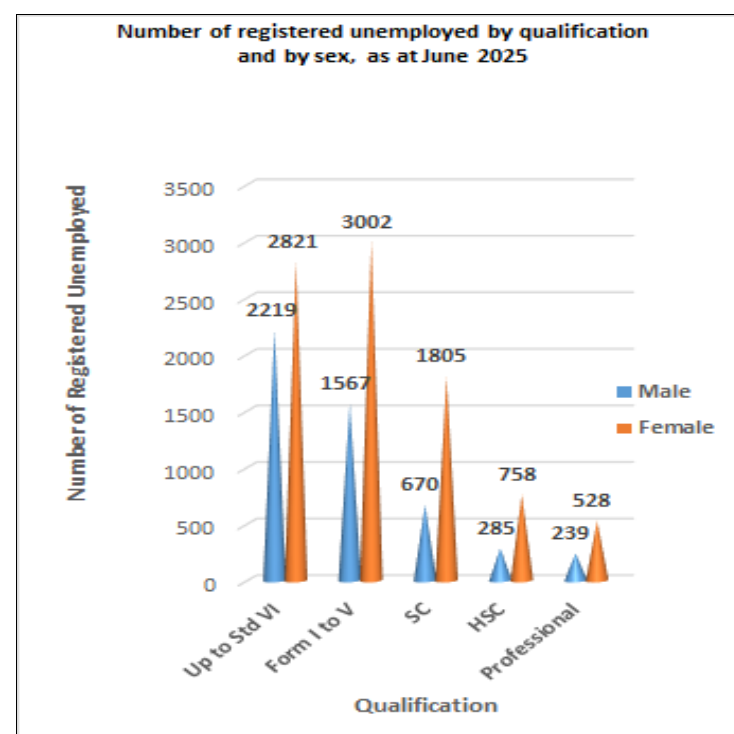
Profiling of unemployed jobseekers, vacancies and placement



The proportion of females among the registered unemployed was 64% against 36% for males.

The proportion of registered unemployed aged between 16 and 29 years was 47% for males and 34% among females respectively.

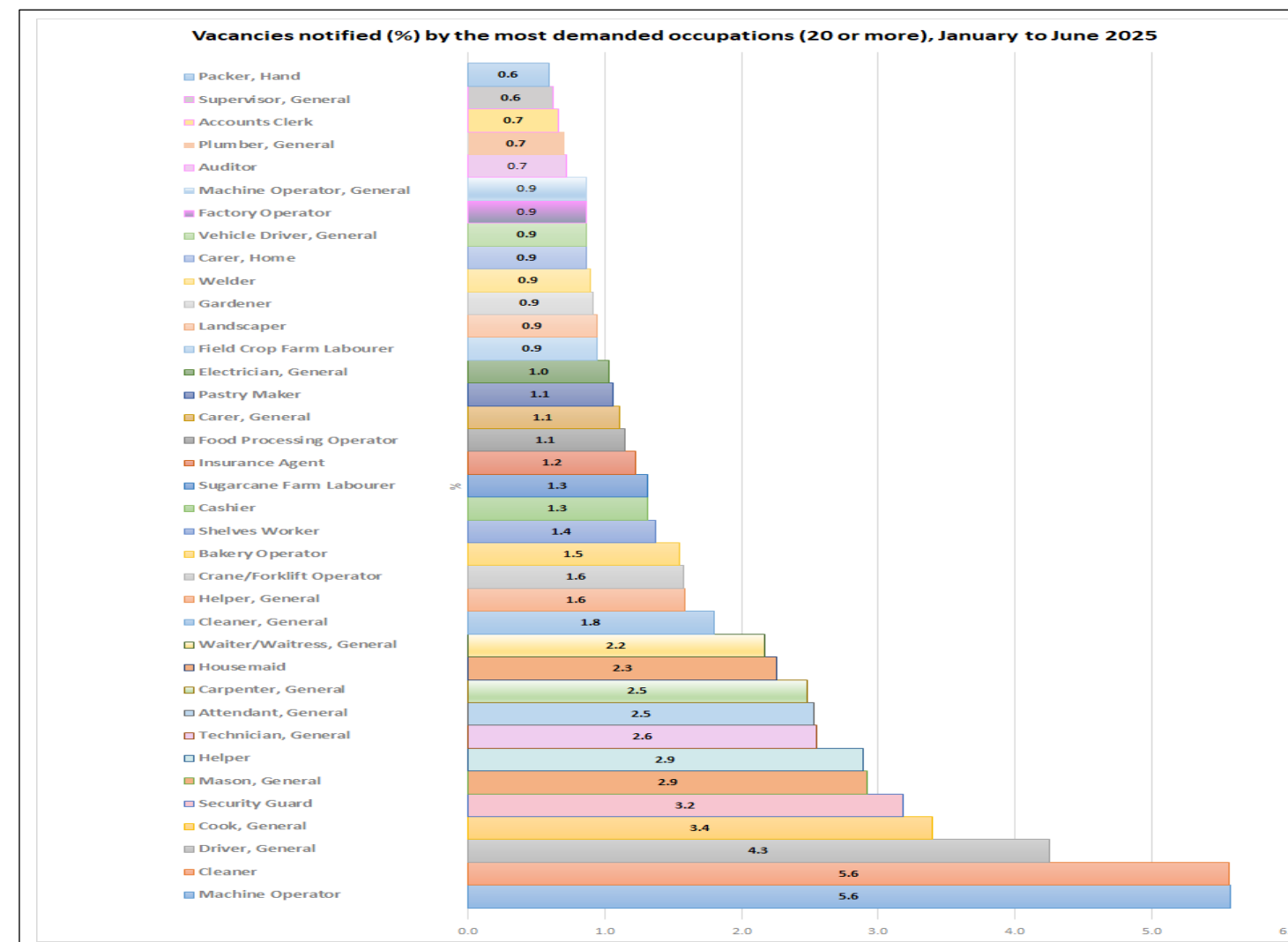
The mean age worked out to 35 years for male and 37 years for female jobseekers.



Among the registered unemployed, some 27% have never been to school or did not pass the Certificate of Primary Education; while about 9% possessed the CPE as the only qualification. Another 33% have followed secondary education (Form I to V), without passing the School Certificate. The proportion of registered unemployed with SC, HSC and tertiary education were 18%, 7% and 6% respectively.

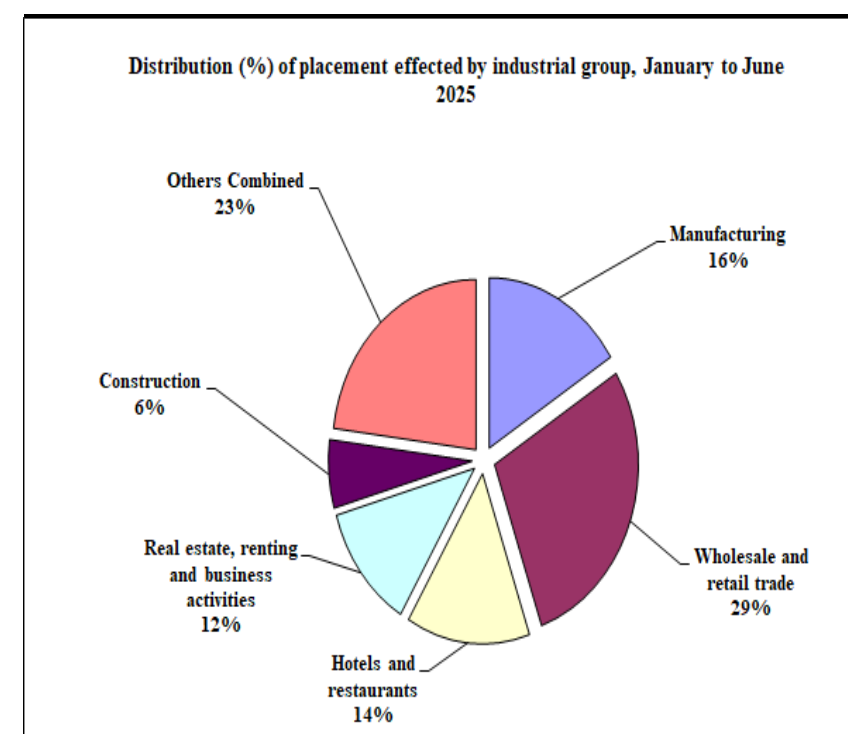
In general, unemployed registered female are more qualified than their male counterparts. The percentage of males and females who did not possess their Certificate of Primary Education was 35% and 23% respectively. On the other hand, 13% of males and 20% of females registered unemployed have attained the School Certificate, 6% of males and 9% of females the Higher School Certificate and 5% of males and 6% of females as professionals.

Vacancies



From January to June 2025, the most in-demand vacancies were Machine Operator and Cleaner, each representing 5.6% of the total vacancies, followed by General Driver at 4.3%.

Placement

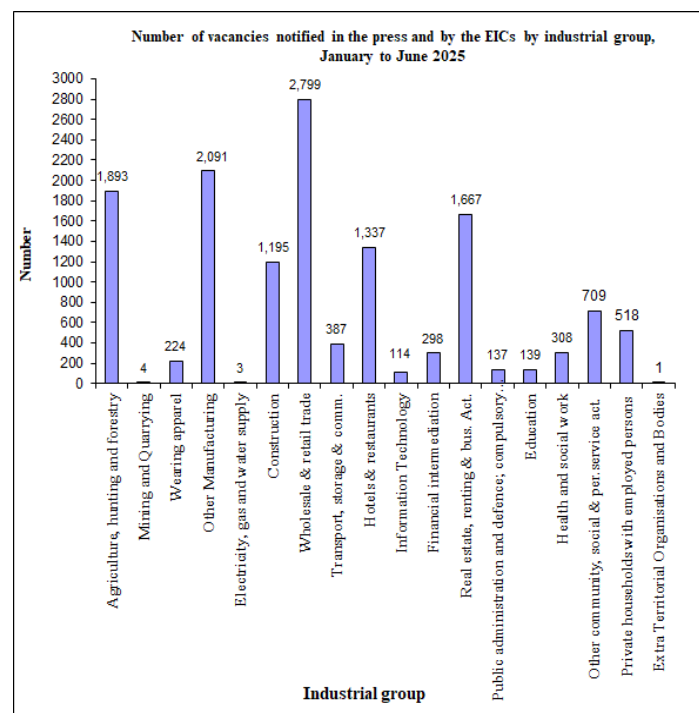


A breakdown of placements by industrial group shows that the majority of the placements made were in the "Wholesale & Retail Trade; repair of motor vehicles, motorcycles & personal and household goods" sector (29%), "Manufacturing" sector (16%) and "Hotels and Restaurants" sector (14%). The remaining placements were effected in companies engaged in other activities

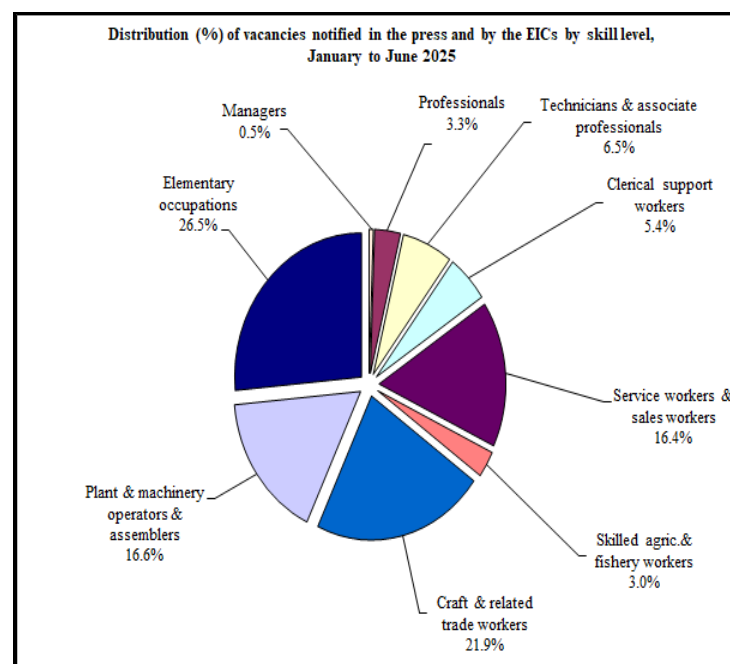

Profiling of unemployed jobseekers, vacancies and placements (Cont'd)



In January to June 2025, vacancies notified in the press and by the EIC numbered to 13,824. The highest number of vacancies being, 2,799 (20%) were advertised in the “*Wholesale and Retail trade*” sector followed by “*Manufacturing including Wearing Apparel*” sector by 2315 (17%) and “*Agriculture, forestry and fishing*” sector by 1,893 (14%).



The distribution of vacancies notified in the press and Employment Information Centres (EICs) by skill level indicates 26.5% for “*Elementary Occupations*”, 16.4% for “*Service and sales workers*”, 16.6% for “*Plant & Machinery operators & assemblers*” workers” and 5.4% for “*Clerical Support workers*”. The “*Managers*” group indicates the lowest vacancies with 0.5%.

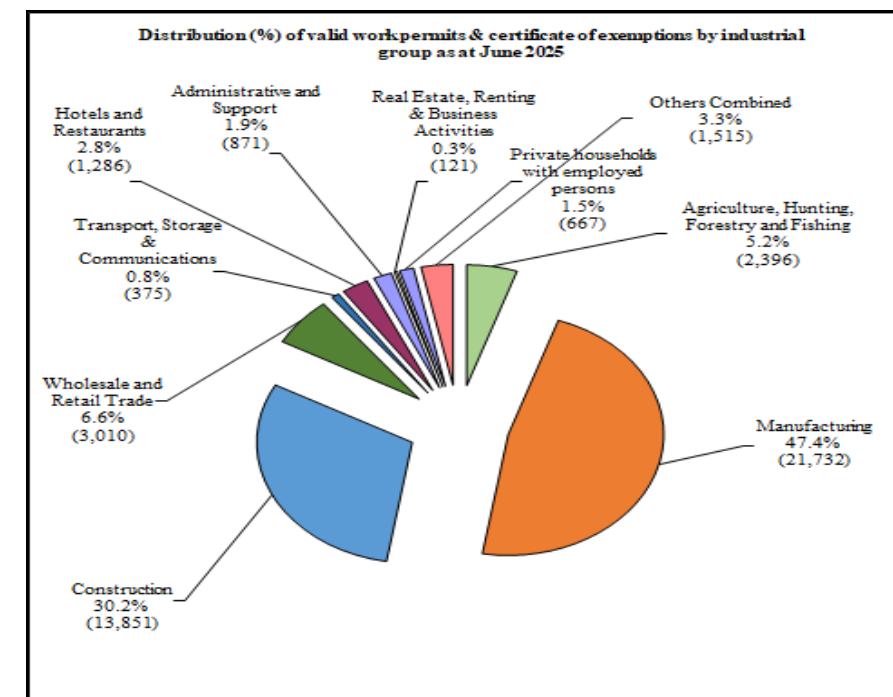
Foreign Workers (Total Work Permits and Certificate of Exemption: 45 824)



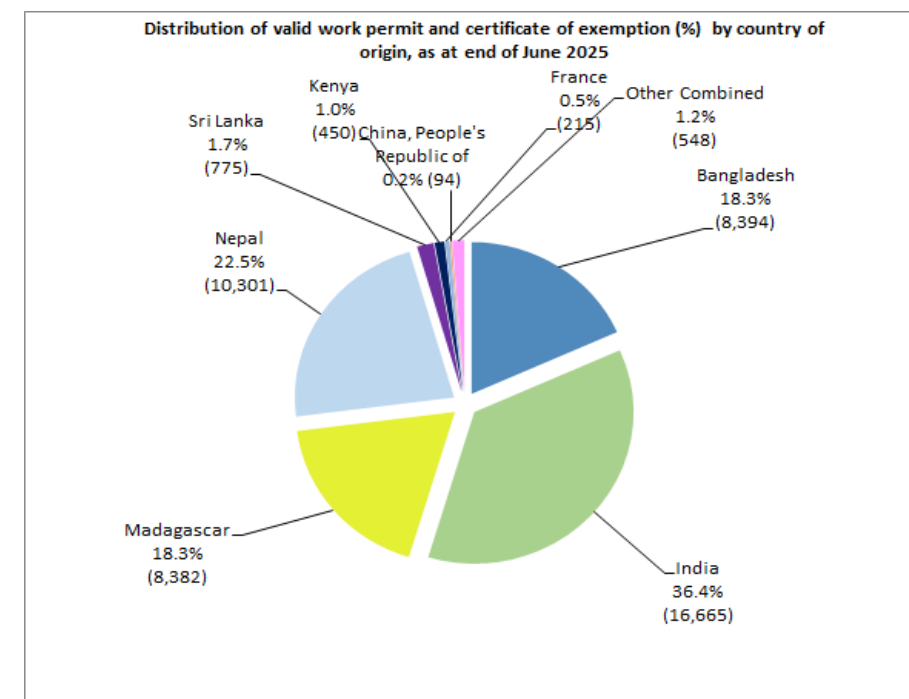

The number of valid work permits and certificates of exemption as at the end of January 2025 stood at 45,824 (40,440 males and 5,384 females). Most of the foreign workers in Mauritius were working in the “*Manufacturing*” sector (47.4%) mainly as Machine Operators in textile, sewing and related fields (27%). The “*Construction*” sector accounted for 30% of foreign workers, with a significant proportion working as Masons (11%).



The countries of origin for the valid work permits and certificates of exemption shows that most of the foreign workers come from India (36.4%), followed by Nepal (22.5%), and both Bangladesh and Madagascar, each accordingly 18.3%.

SECTION I



National Employment Department Semester Bulletin – January to June 2025

1. Introduction

This is a monthly bulletin prepared by the Ministry of Labour and Industrial Relations to present data on registered unemployed, vacancies, placements of jobseekers and work permits. This present issue refers to the months of January to June 2025 for the Island of Mauritius and Island of Rodrigues.

The data are compiled based on information collected at the thirteen Employment Information Centres (EICs) throughout the island and at the different units of the National Employment Department.

Registered unemployed comprise new registrants, re-registrants and those maintaining their registration. “New registrants” refers to new jobseekers wishing to be placed on the live register of unemployed of the National Employment Department. “Re-registrants” refers to those who have ceased registration for a period not exceeding two years, and come back to be re-admitted on the live register. If the break is more than two years then the case will be considered as a new one.

2. Registered jobseekers as at the end of June 2025

The total number of registered unemployed at the end of June 2025 stood at 13,894 (4,980 males and 8,914 females). These figures include laid off workers who are registered under the Workfare Programme.

In addition to registered unemployed, 20,534 jobseekers (10,267 males and 10,267 females), who though already in employment, were registered at the Employment Information Centres, in search of a better job.

2.1 Distribution of registered unemployed by sex and age, qualification, length of registration, occupational group, district, locality and disability as at the end of June 2025

2.1.1 Distribution by sex and age (Tables 2 and 9)

The proportion of females among the registered unemployed was 64% against 36% for males. The proportion of registered unemployed aged between 16 and 29 years was 47% for males and 34% among females respectively. The mean age worked out to 35 years for male and 37 years for female jobseekers. The table below provides for the profile of registered unemployed jobseekers by age group.

2.1.2 Distribution by qualification (Table 9)

Among the registered unemployed, some 27% have never been to school or did not pass the Certificate of Primary Education; while about 9% possessed the CPE as the only qualification. Another 33% have followed secondary education (Form I to V), without passing the School Certificate. The proportion of registered unemployed with SC, HSC and tertiary education were 18%, 7% and 6% respectively.

In general, female registered unemployed are more qualified than their male counterparts. The percentage of males and females who did not possess their Certificate of Primary Education was 35% and 23% respectively. On the other hand, 13% of males and 20% of females registered unemployed have attained the School Certificate, 6% of males and 9% of females the Higher School Certificate and 5% of males and 6% of females as professionals. The next table provides for the profile of registered unemployed jobseekers by qualification and sex.

2.1.3 Distribution by length of registration (Table 9)

Out of the 13,894 registered unemployed as at the end of June 2025, 21% have registered for less than one year and 14% have been registered for a period between one and three years. It is to be noted that 57% have been on the registration list for five years or more. On average, an unemployed has been in registration for 3.6 years. The average length of registration for females being slightly higher than that of males, 3.7 years compared to 3.2 years.

2.1.4 Number of registered unemployed & In employment by EICs & Gender (Table 10)

Table 10 provides for the number of registered Unemployed and In Employment jobseekers by EIC and sex, as at the end of June 2025.

2.1.5 Comparison with the previous month (Table 11)

Compared to December 2024, the number of registered unemployed has decreased by 493 from 14,387 from December 2024 to 13,894 for June 2025 (Table 11).

2.1.6 Distribution by occupational group (Table 12)

Registered unemployed are classified into occupational groups according to their previous work experience or their technical or professional qualifications. Among the 13,894 unemployed registrants, (24%) were classified as “Clerical Support Workers”, (23%) were classified as “Service and Sales Workers” and (18%) were engaged in “Elementary Occupations. About (4%) had never worked and did not possess any technical or professional qualifications while (6%) were classified as “Managers; Professionals”.

2.1.7 Geographical distribution (Tables 13 & 14)

Table 13 gives the distribution of registered unemployed by district and sex. An analysis of registered unemployed by locality shows that the region of Port Louis had the greatest number of registered unemployed (1,576) followed by Curepipe and Rose Hill (655 and 545 respectively). The lowest number of registered unemployed are at Tamarin (22), followed by Case Noyale (28) and Camp Diable (33).

2.1.8 Registered unemployed with disabilities (Table 15)

Among the 13,894 unemployed registrants, 111 persons with disabilities were looking for work comprising of 72 males and 39 females. Table 15 gives the number of registered unemployed with disabilities by their type of disability.

2.2 New registration, re-registration and maintaining registration in June 2025

2.2.1 New registration

In January to June 2025, 2,809 persons (1,359 males and 1,450 females) have registered themselves as unemployed for the first time (Table 16). Compared to July to December 2024, the number of new unemployed registrants has increased by 115 from 2,694 for July to December 2024 to 2,809 for January to June 2025 (Table 17).

About 69% of the new registrants were aged between 16 and 29 years old and 14% were aged between 30 and 39 old. Those aged 40 years and above amounted to 482 i.e. 17% (Table 18).

Among years the new unemployed registrants, for the month of January to June 2025, 1,419 (51%) have never been to school or have attained only primary school level. Of these 380 (27%) have achieved the Certificate of Primary Education. Some 20% have followed the secondary education without passing the School Certificate; 13% had the School Certificate and 11% possessed the Higher School Certificate as their highest qualification. Among the new registrants, 166 (6%) were holders of professional qualifications (Table 18).

Out of the 2,809 new registrants, 191 (7%) persons had neither worked before nor undergone any technical or professional training. Some 23% had previous work experience or were qualified to work as “Clerical Support Workers” and 19% of the new unemployed registrants were classified under “Service and sales workers”. About 17% had been engaged in “Elementary Occupations”. Among the new registered unemployed, 179 (6%) had work experience or were qualified as “Managers; Professionals” (Table 19).

2.2.2 Re-registration and maintaining registration

The total number of re-registration for the month of January to June 2025 stood at 4,243 (1,851 males and 2,392 females). A total of 16,670 unemployed persons (5,487 males and 11,183 females) reported to the Employment Information Centres to maintain their registration (Table 16).

3. In employment and seeking another job

During the month of January to June 2025, 6,247 persons who, though already in employment, registered themselves at the Employment Information Centres in search of better jobs. Among them, 1,245 (746 males and 499 females) were new registrants and 5,002 (2,985 males and 2,017 females) were re-registrants (Table 20).

There were also 25,808 registrants, in employment, who reported to the Employment Information Centres to maintain their registration comprising of 12,541 males and 13,267 females.

4. De-Registration

De-Registration refers to jobseekers who fail to maintain their registration during the month and consequently their applications are removed from the live register and placed in a dormant register.

During the month of January to June 2025, 14,346 (6,994 males and 7,352 females) jobseekers have de-registered their application as jobseeker, out of which 6,642 (2,932 males and 3,710 females) were unemployed jobseekers and 7,704 (4,062 males and 3,642 females) as in employment jobseekers (Table 21).

5. Vacancies

In January to June 2025, vacancies notified to the Employment Information Centres numbered to 12,620. The highest number of vacancies being, 2,779 was advertised in the “*Wholesale & retail trade; repair of m/vehicles, motorcycles & personal & household goods*” sector (Table 22).

A total of 1204 vacancies has been notified in the press during the month of January to June 2025. The highest of the vacancies were from “*Other community, social and personal service activities*” sector with 306 vacancies (Table 23).

Overall, the total number of vacancies notified for the month of June 2025 was 13,824. The next table provides for the number of vacancies notified in January to June 2025.

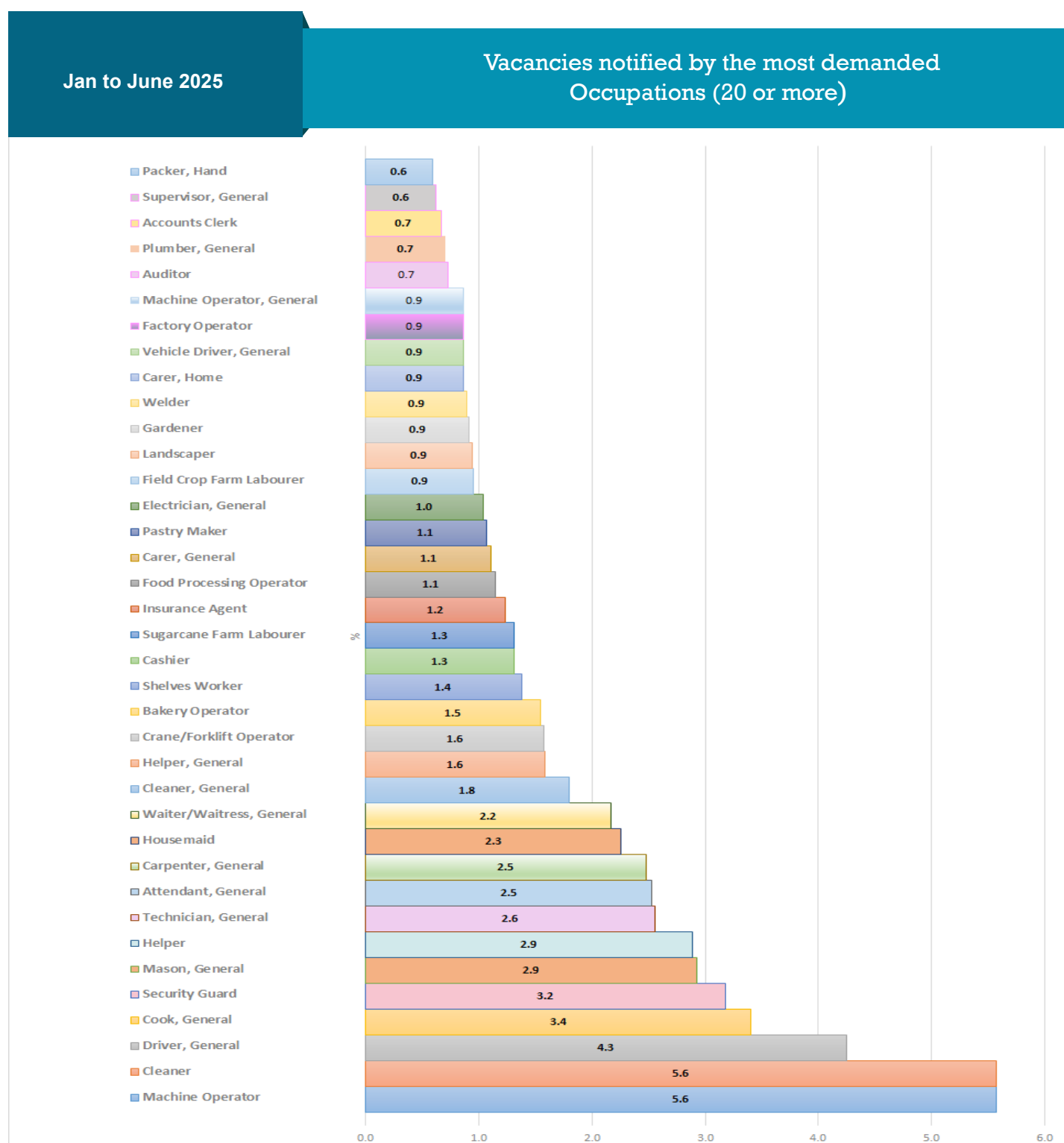

Table 24 shows the distribution of vacancies by industry and skill level. Compared to July to December 2024, the number of vacancies for the month of January to June 2025 has increased by 1,606 as shown in Table 25.

From January to June 2025, the most in-demand vacancies were Machine Operator and Cleaner, each representing 5.6% of the total vacancies, followed by General Driver at 4.3%.

6. Workfare Programme

The role of the National Employment Department is to facilitate redeployment of laid-off workers for those who have opted for job placement. The laid off workers are eligible to a Transitional Unemployment Benefit (TUB) for a period of maximum 12 months.

The number of laid-off workers still registered under the Workfare Programme as at 30 June 2025 stood at 2,573 (1,375 males, 1,198 females).

For the month of January to June 2025, 973 laid off workers (516 males, 457 females) were registered. 385 laid off workers (222 males, 163 females) were placed during the same month.

7. Magazine de L'Emploi et des Metiers



During the month of January to June 2025, 23 programmes consisting of 1,612 vacancies were broadcast.

Reportages were conducted on service delivery by Career Guidance Unit, on job opportunities in the hotel sector by Career Guidance Unit, on job fair for Star Knitwear Ltd, job opportunities in the manufacturing sector, "Personal Development" by Career Guidance Unit, on the Job & Training Fair @ Super U Grand Baie organised by the Ministry and Job Dating conducted by Riviere Des Anguilles EIC, training programmes implemented by Polytechnics, Trainee Engineer Scheme and the Women Back to Work Programme by this Ministry, in the BPO, as well as training programmes implemented at this Ministry during the month of January to June 2025.

Twenty-five (14 Males, 11 Females) jobseekers were placed during the said months.

Since the start of the programme in 21 April 2007, the number of jobseekers placed has reached 12,421.

9. Youth Employment Programme, Dual Training Programme, Back to Work Programme and Trainee Engineer Scheme



9.1 The Youth Employment Programme (YEP) which started in 2013 is meant for unemployed youth aged between 16 and 35 years and provides them with training and placement in an enterprise for an initial period of one year with the possibility of one additional year of placement with another enterprise. The Programme provides for the payment of a monthly stipend to the youth as follows:

HSC : Rs 8,000
 Diploma : Rs 10,000
 Graduates: Rs 15,000

50% of the stipend is refunded to the employer by Government as well as 50% of the training cost up to a maximum of Rs 7,500 per youth.

Since December 2015, the YEP has been extended to the public sector.

According to the YEP Secretariat, there is a total number of 47,373 (19,616 males and 27, 757 females) youth registered with YEP as at 30 June 2025.

The number of Employers registered with YEP is 8,227, out of which 36% are actively participating in the recruitment process.

The number of jobseekers placed in companies through the YEP as at 30 June 2025 is 25,714 (11,463 males and 14,251 females). 51 (23 males and 28 females) jobseekers were placed in the public and private sectors. 32 jobseekers (17 males and 15 females) were placed in the private sector out of which 47% in “*Professional, Scientific & Technical Activities*” sector, 31% in “*Information and Communication*” sector and 13% in “*Construction*” sector (Table 26). The remaining 19 (6 males and 13 females) jobseekers were placed in the public sector during the month of January to June 2025.



9.2 The Dual Training Programme (DTP), launched in September 2015 provides for unemployed Mauritians to follow a Diploma or Degree Course with a tertiary institution registered with either the Tertiary Education Commission or the Mauritius Qualifications Authority in fields required by the labour market, with placement in an enterprise. Under the Programme, trainees will be paid a monthly stipend of Rs 6,000 for a maximum period of three years. As for employers, they will be refunded 60% of the course fees, per year per trainee as well as the stipend for a maximum of three years. After satisfactory completion of the course, the trainees may be employed.

According to the DTP secretariat, 69 companies have registered in the DTP and 232 trainees have successfully completed their training, out of which 109 males and 123 females. The trainees have

completed their training programme in different courses such as BTS Assistant de Gestion, BTS Services Informatiques aux Organisations and Technician Diploma in Mechanical and Electrical Engineering. The training institutions are Université des Mascareignes and MCCI Business School. 171 trainees have obtained permanent jobs after completion of the training.

5 trainees including 3 males and 2 females are currently on placement with private companies.



9.3 The Woman Back to Work Programme (WBTWP) which was launched in September 2015 is meant for women above 30 years of age to enable them take up or resume employment. The Programme provides for the placement of women in a job for an initial period of one year following which they might be employed. During the placement period, the women will be paid a stipend up to a maximum of Rs 10,575 and will get the opportunity of following training in a registered institution.

Employers enrolling women on placement under the Programme will be refunded the training cost up to a maximum of Rs 7,500 per woman as well as the stipend for the placement period.

According to the WBTWP secretariat, as at the end of June 2025, 1,012 employers are registered in the programme, out of which 39% participated actively. 7,201 women are registered in the programme and 1,480 have been placed, out of which 31% in the “*Wholesale and trade*” sector and 27% in the “*Manufacturing*” sector. 775 women have obtained permanent jobs after completion of their placement.

For the month of June 2025, 166 women and 14 employers have registered for the first time while 2 women were placed.

In addition, to further empower those women, technical courses are currently being dispensed to them by MITD. The courses are fully sponsored by this Ministry and a stipend of Rs 10,575 are paid to them at the end of the course. 607 unemployed women under the WBTWP have been trained in Bakery/Pastry, Beauty Therapy, Hairdressing, Care of the Elderly and Disabled, Early Childhood care and Flower Arrangements and Basic IT Application Skills.



9.4 Government has found that there is a bottleneck regarding pre- registration of engineers at the Council of Registered Professional Engineers (CRPE). The requirements of two years practical training under the supervision of professional engineers could not be entertained for lack of training possibilities for our graduates in engineering.

Government thus announced a special scheme in the Budget Programme 2016-2017, for the placement of trainee engineers.

The objective of the TES is to enable Graduates in engineering to qualify for registration with the Council of Registered Professional Engineers of Mauritius and to operate as full-fledged engineers.

The requirements for enlistment of trainees for the Trainee Engineer Scheme: Degree holders in engineering plus eligibility certificate stage 1 from the Council of Registered Professional Engineer.

As at 31 June 2025, the number of applications received for the scheme was 1,715 (1,268 males and 447 females). The number of placements effected in the public sector was 552 (431 males and 121 females) and in the private sector was 480 (363 males and 117 females). Most placements were made in the following fields: 46% in “*Civil Engineering*”, 22% in “*Mechanical Engineering*” and 15% in “*Electrical and Electronics Engineering*”.

19 employers of the public sector and 96 of the private sectors are participating in the scheme as at 31 June 2025. The number of placements for the months of January to June 2025 stood at 50 (39 males and 11 females): 32 jobseekers (25 males and 7 females) were placed in the private sector and the remaining 18 (14 males and 4 females) jobseekers were placed in the public sector.



10. Trainee Land Surveyor Scheme (TLSS)

Government announced in the Budget programme 2023/2024 a scheme for the placement of trainee land surveyors to facilitate pre-registration training in Land Surveying.

To be enlisted as trainees, candidates should hold a Diploma in Land Surveying of the University of Mauritius or such other qualifications as may be prescribed in accordance with the Land Surveyors Act.

The trainees will undergo and complete, the period of two years' practical training under the direct supervision of a Land Surveyor in order to qualify for registration as Land Surveyor in order to qualify for registration as Land Surveyor under the provisions of the Land Surveyors Act and will be paid a monthly stipend of Rs 26,050 and refund of bus fares accordingly.

As at June 2025, 1 male trainee is under placement under this scheme.



11. Training and Placement of Persons with Disabilities (TPPD)

Mauritius has signed and ratified the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD). Article 27 of the Convention relates to Work and Employment of Persons with Disabilities.

Government announced in the Budget programme 2022/2023 a special programme to facilitate the training and placement of persons with disabilities.

The objective of the programme is to ensure inclusion of persons with disabilities in the open labour market.

To benefit from this programme trainees must be registered with the Training and Employment of Disabled Persons Board (TEDPB).

Trainees placed under this programme will benefit from a monthly stipend of Rs 10,000 plus travelling allowance of Rs. 1,000 for a maximum period of one year.

As at June 2025, the total number of placements effected in the public sector is 20 (9 males and 11 females).

12. Outward Labour Migration

Recruitment by Phoenix GMI

A recruitment agency from Quebec, Pheonix GMI that was registered on the website of mauritiusjobs in December 2021, has been continuously advertising vacancies on the website since January 2022.

For the month of January and February 2025, 6 male candidates from Mauritius have been offered a job in the following sector in Quebec.

13. Job Placement

13.1 Placement is made according to the job requirements of employers. For the month of January to June 2025, 12,620 vacancies have been processed by the Employment Information Centres and 11,966 registrants were referred for employment by the latter. Out of the 11,966 (4,923 males and 7,043 females) referred jobseekers, 1,364 declined job offers, 1,534 failed to report to employers and 5,913 were not selected. There were 1,583 registrants who reported that they have been employed and the

result of referral for 1,345 remaining applicants was not yet known. For the month of June 2025, placement has been effected for about 13% of the vacancies processed (Table 26).

Some vacancies for the month of December 2024 have been processed during the month of June 2025 leading to 227 additional placements being made.

As regards placement in the public sector, 228 vacancies have been reported for which 930 jobseekers has been referred and 17 jobseekers have been placed for previous vacancies.

Furthermore, 385 persons registered under the “*Workfare Programme*” have been placed, 25 persons through the TV programme “*Magazine de L’Emploi et des Metiers*”, 21 persons through the “*Job Management System*”, 49 persons through the “*Youth Employment Programme*”, 1 person through the “*Back to Work Programme*”, 50 persons through the “*Trainee Engineer Scheme*”, 6 persons through the “*Training and Placements of Persons with Disabilities*” and 6 persons through “*Outward Labour Migration*”,. Thus, the total number of placements, for the month of January to June 2025, amounted to 2,370 (Table 27) and as shown below.

13.2 The disparity between the number of vacancies reported and the number of persons placed can be explained by unwillingness of job seekers to accept job offers and also by some criteria set by the employers. Some jobseekers refused job offers because of the conditions of work e.g. low salary, overtime or night duty. Most of the jobseekers refused the jobs offered to them as they are looking for public sector jobs. For some vacancies, no suitable candidates were available.

In some cases, employers were not satisfied with referred candidates and consequently the vacancies were filled by the employers themselves. Some candidates were not selected by employers as according to the latter they were not suitable for the work or lack previous experience. Employers were

not willing to offer higher salaries, thus the jobseekers who were looking for a better pay were not selected by the employers.

13.3 A breakdown of placements by industrial group shows that the majority of the placements made were in the “*Wholesale & Retail Trade; repair of motor vehicles, motorcycles & personal and household goods*” sector (519), “*Manufacturing*” sector (290) and “*Hotels and Restaurants*” sector (252). The remaining placements were effected in companies engaged in other activities (Table 27).

14. Work Permits and Certificates of Exemption

For the months of January to June 2025, the number of new work permits issued was 5,883 (5,312 males and 571 females). The majority of the new work permits issued was for the “*Manufacturing*” sector with 2,295 (39%) and “*Construction*” sector with 1,802 (31%). (Table 29 & 32). Out of the 5,883 new work permits issued, 2,243 (40%) were allocated to Nepalese workers, 2,017 (34%) to Indian workers, and 1,239 (21%) to Malagasy workers (Tables 31).

The number of work permits renewed for the months of January to June 2025 amounted to 4,571 (4,141 males and 430 females) out of which 2,210 (48%) were for the “*Manufacturing*” sector and 2,044 (45%) for the “*Construction*” sector (Table 30 & 32). The majority of the work permits renewed were for Bangladeshi, Indian, Nepalese, and Malagasy workers with 1,757 (38%), 1,142 (25%), 1,102 (24%) and 481(11%) work permits respectively as shown in Table 31.

The number of new certificates of exemption issued and renewed for the months of January to June 2025 amounted to 2,647 (1,029 New and 1,618 Renewed). The majority were from India with 1,585 (60%) followed by Nepal with 788 (30%) (Table 33).

As at end of June 2025, the number of valid work permits and certificate of exemption stood at 45,824 (40,440 males and 5,384 females). Most foreign workers in Mauritius were employed in “*Manufacturing*” sector (47%) mainly as Machine Operators in textile, sewing and related fields (27%). The “*Construction*” sector accounted for 30% of foreign workers, with a significant proportion working as Masons (11%) (Table 34 & Table 35).

The countries of origin for the valid work permits and certificates of exemption are given in Table 36. Most of the foreign workers come from India (36%), followed by Nepal (22%), and both Bangladesh and Madagascar, each accordingly 18%. (Table 36).

The majority of foreigners came from Nepal, India and Bangladesh work in the “*Manufacturing*” and “*Construction*” Sectors as Machine Operators and Mason (Table 35 and 37).

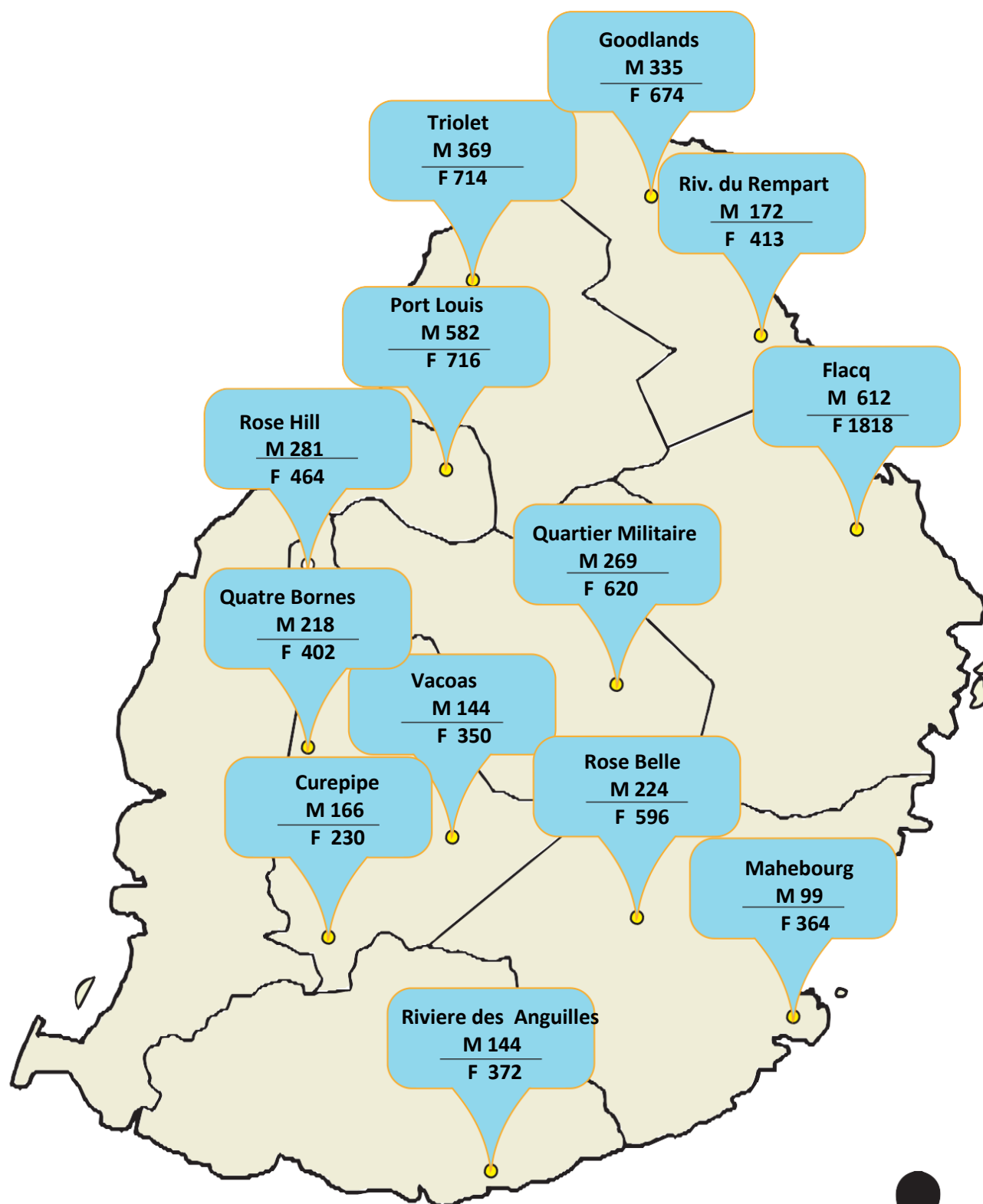

Figure 2 - Registered unemployed (%) by educational attainment, as at end of June 2025

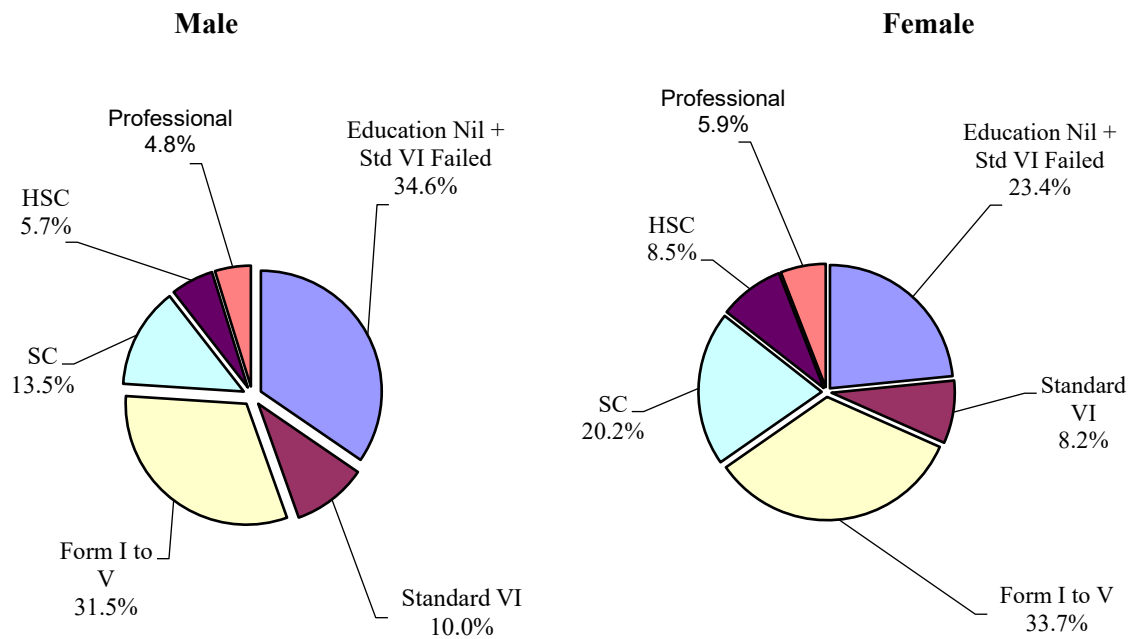


Figure 3 - Number of registered unemployed by age group & sex, as at end of June 2025

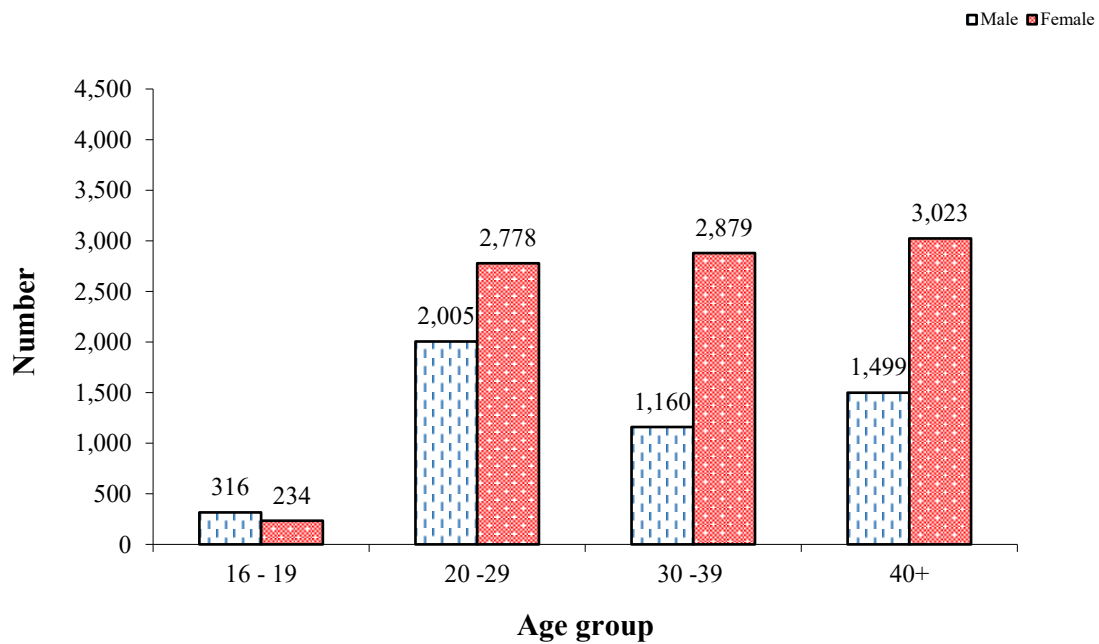

Fig 4 - Number of vacancies notified in the press and by the EICs by industrial group, January to June 2025

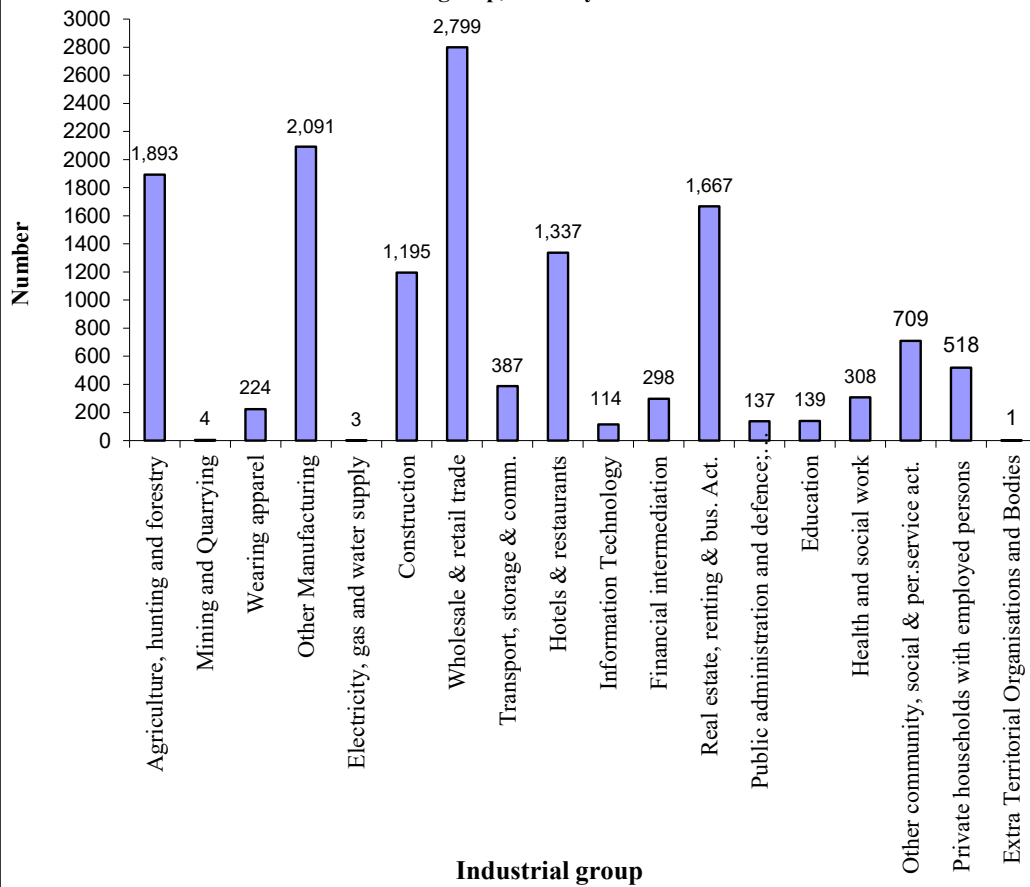


Fig 5 - Distribution (%) of vacancies notified in the press and by the EICs by skill level, January to June 2025

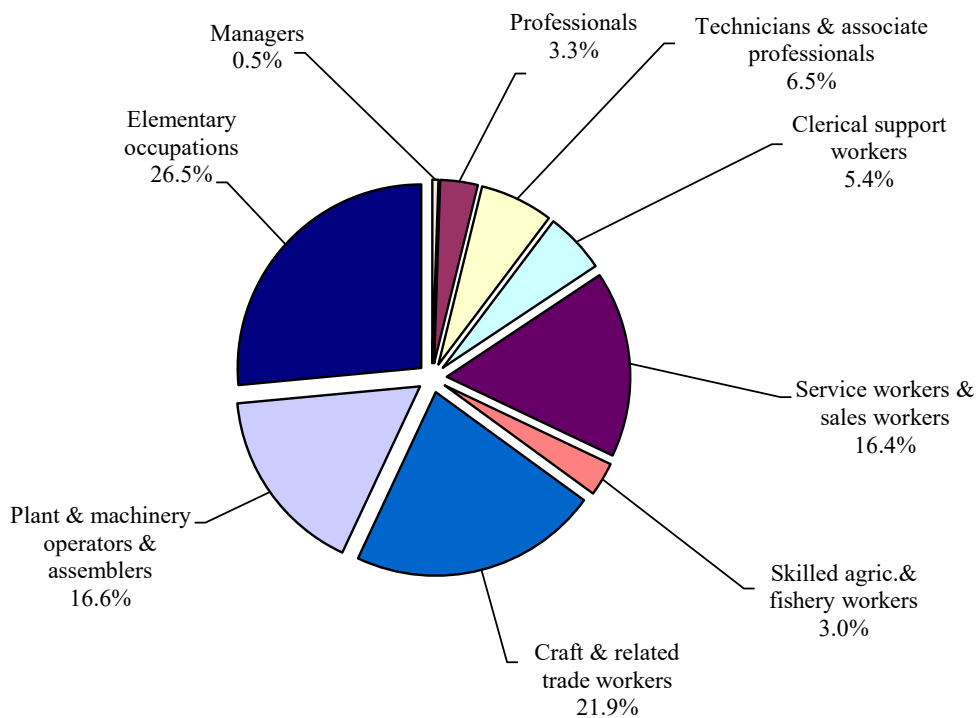

Figure 6 - Distribution (%) of new work permits & renewed work permits by country of origin, January to June 2025

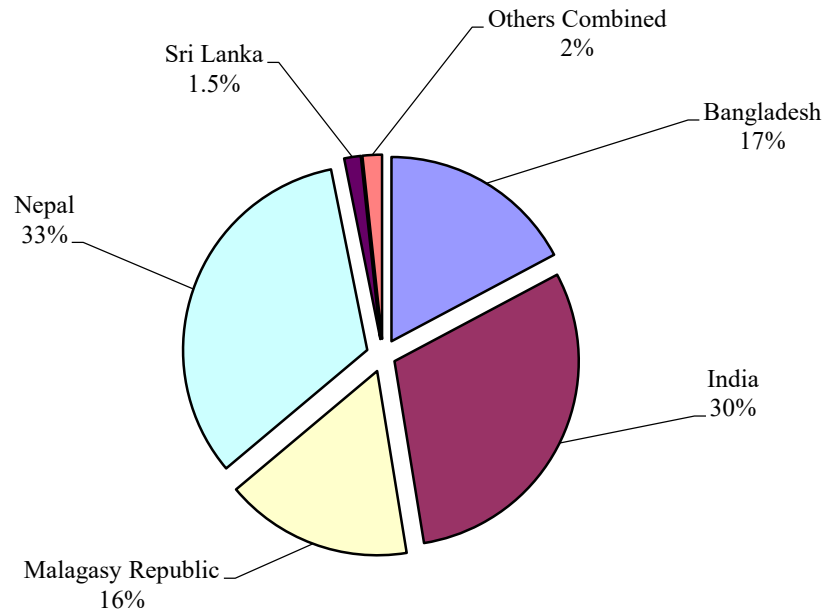


Figure 7 - Number of new work permits & renewed work permits by industrial group, January to June 2025

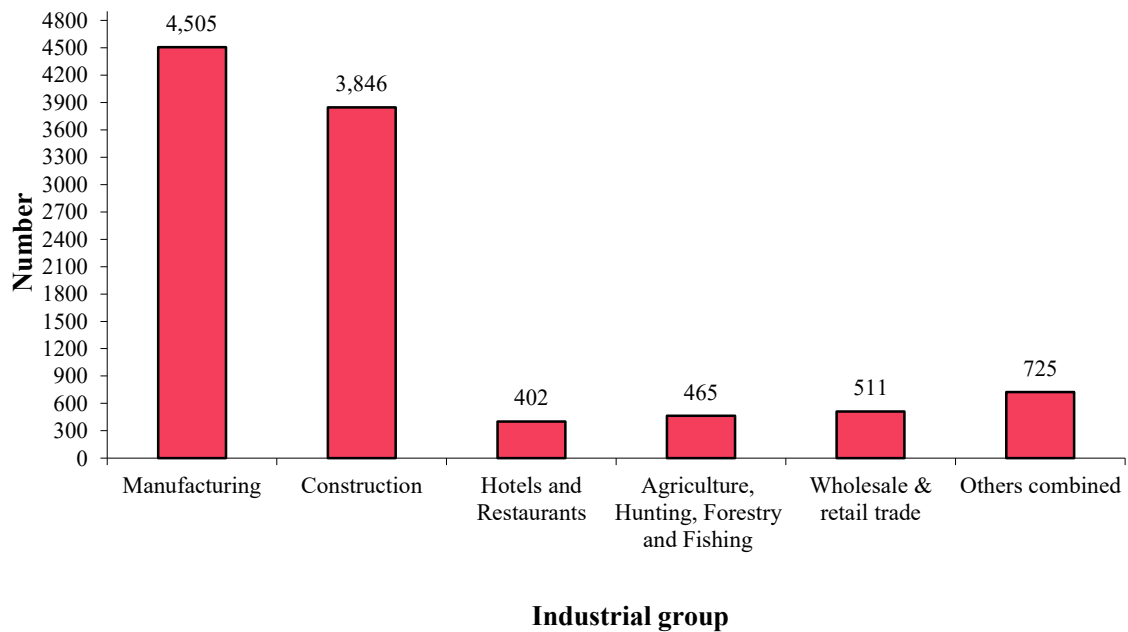

Section II – Rodrigues Island

1. Introduction

This section presents data on registered jobseekers for Rodrigues Island. The functioning of the Employment Information Centre in Rodrigues is similar to that in Mauritius.

2. Registered Unemployed

The number of registered unemployed as at the end of June 2025 was 3,385 (1,276 males and 2,109 females), while the number of registrants in employment amounted to 1,313 consisting of 589 males and 724 females (Table 1.1). 46% of the unemployed persons were aged between 16 and 29 years (Table 1.2).

The educational attainment of unemployed registrants was mainly in the category “Form I to V (including SC failed)” at 39%. Only 105 registrants had their Higher School Certificate. The length of unemployment of 18% of the registered unemployed was less than 2 years, and about 67% had been looking for work for 5 years or more. The average length of registration worked out to 4.0 years. The average length of registration for females being slightly higher than that of males, 3.8 years compared to 4.1 years (Tables 1.3 and 1.4).

As regards previous work experience, 490 registrants had, in the past, worked or were qualified to work as “Craft & related trades workers”. The proportion of those who have never worked and did not possess any technical or professional qualifications is higher among female unemployed; 6% of the latter have never worked, compared to 3% of males unemployed (Table 1.5).

3. New registrants and re-registrants

For the month of January to June 2025, 586 new unemployed jobseekers have registered themselves consisting of 291 males and 295 females. The number of unemployed re-registrants and the number of unemployed jobseekers who reported for maintaining their registration are 1,172 (536 males and 636 females) and 4,951 (1,813 males and 3,138 females) respectively.

For in employment, there were 168 new registrant (99 males and 69 females) and 1,386 re-registrants (891 males and 495 females). 2013 (889 males and 1,124 females) in employment registrants reported to the Employment Information Centres to maintain their registration (Table 1.6).

4. Registered unemployed with disabilities

Among the 3,385 unemployed registrants, there were 9 persons with disabilities who were looking for work comprising of 5 males and 4 females (Table 1.7).

Figure 8 - Registered unemployed (%) by educational attainment for Island of Rodrigues, as at end June 2025

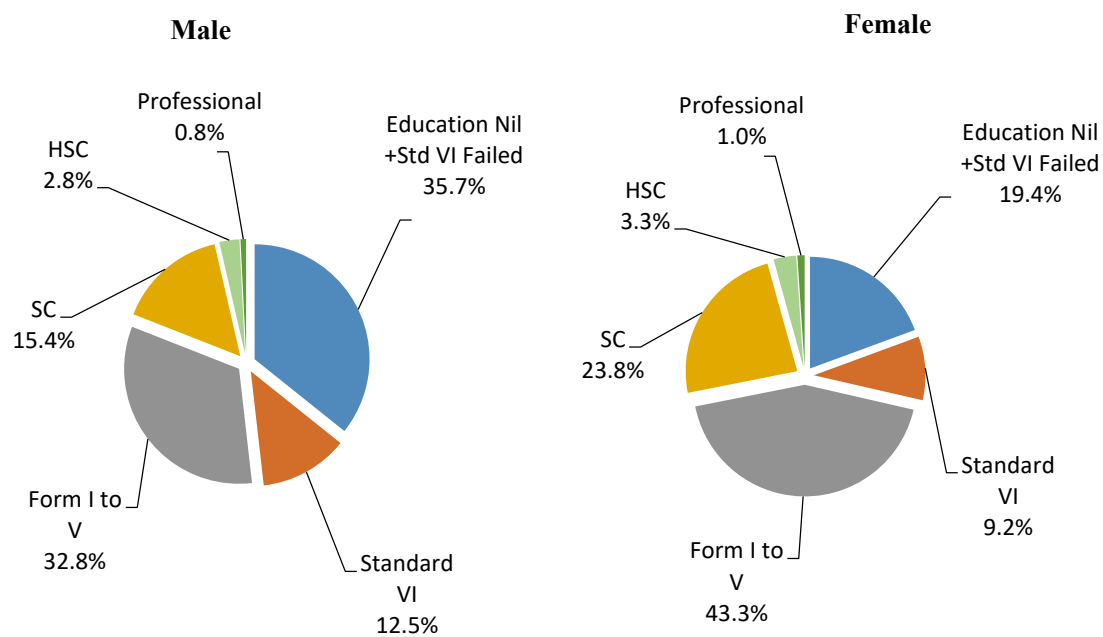


Figure 9 - Number of registered unemployed by age group & sex for Island of Rodrigues, as at end of June 2025

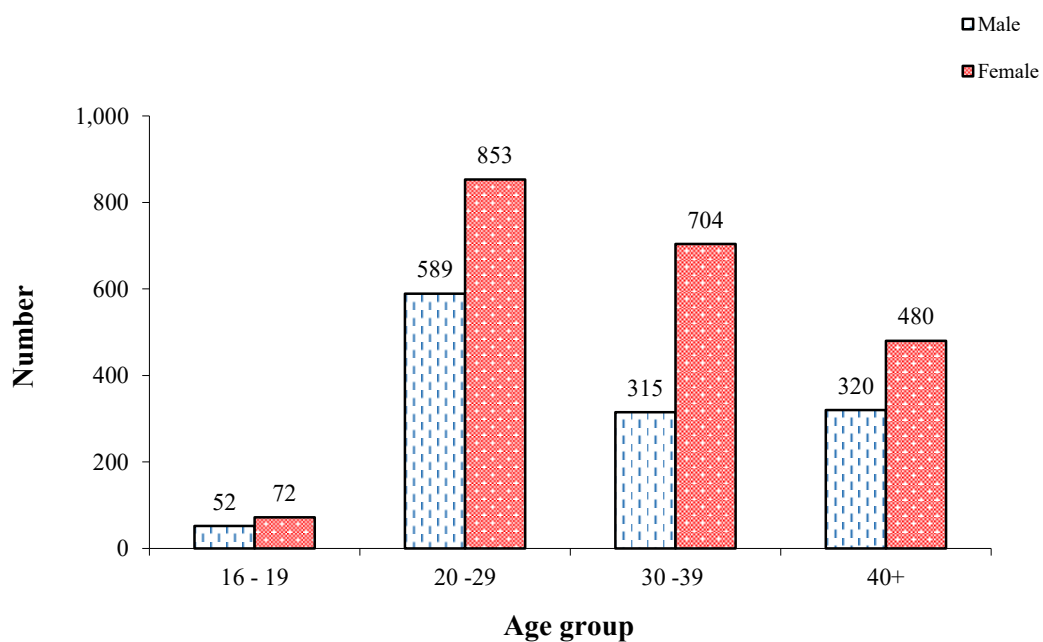

GLOSSARY

Active Population or Labour Force - active population or labour force is made up of employed and unemployed population.

Activity Rate - activity rate is the ratio (%) of labour force to population aged 16+ (active and inactive population)

Back to Work Programme (BTWP) - a programme launched in June 2015, is meant for women above 35 years of age to enable them take up or resume employment. All women should register first as unemployed at the EIC before applying at BTWP.

Certificate of Exemption- the Employment (Non-Citizens) (Restriction) Exemptions Regulations 1970, stipulates that certain categories of expatriates are exempted from a work permit during his/her period of employment in Mauritius.

De-Registration - jobseekers who fail to maintain their registration during the month and consequently their applications are removed from the live register and placed in a dormant register.

Disability - any limitation to perform a daily life activity in a manner considered normal for persons of their age.

Dual Training Programme (DTP) - a programme launched in 2015 is a mix of practical on-the-job training and classroom studies. The main objective of the DTP is to address the problem of skills mismatch in the labour market and to ensure the availability of skilled manpower for employers.

Educational attainment - the highest level of education completed, whereas for persons attending school, it refers to the standard, form or course being attended.

Employment - employed population aged 16 years and above (16+) who have worked for pay, profit or family gain for at least one hour during the reference week of a month. It includes those who are temporarily absent from work for reasons such as leave with pay, leave without pay and temporary disorganisation of work (bad weather, breakdown of equipment, lack of order, etc.).

Employment Information Centres (EIC) - the thirteen public Employment Office found in Mauritius and one in Rodrigues where among others attention is being given to jobseekers.

Industrial Group - the national classification based on ISIC (International Industrial Classification of Economic Activities) Rev 3 of United Nations is the reference classification of productive activities. Its main purpose is to provide a set of activity categories that can be utilised for the collection and reporting of statistics according to such activities.

In-employment jobseekers at EIC - persons who are in some sort of employment and are in search of a well remunerated or secured job.

Inflation rate - inflation rate as measured by the Consumer Price Index (CPI) is the percentage change in the level of prices from one period to another. It is measured by comparing the average level of prices during a twelve-month period with the average level during the corresponding previous twelve-month period. The CPI is an indicator of changes over time in the general level of goods and services acquired by Mauritian consumers.

Jobseeker - Any citizen of Mauritius aged 16 years and above who is actively looking for employment and is available to work.

Job Management System - The website of the National Employment Department, where employers and jobseekers interact freely. The website <https://mauritiusjobs.govmu.org> was launched in June 2014. Jobseekers register their Curriculum Vitae (CV) and apply for jobs; while employers input vacancies and search for candidates.

Labour migration - The movement of people from one country to another for employment in a better environment.

Live Register - the database of jobseekers who are registering at the National Employment Department.

Magazine de L'Emploi et des Metiers - A television programme for broadcast of vacancies and information on the world of work. It also includes radio talk shows and debates on television relating to the labour market.

New registrant - a jobseeker who apply for registration for the first time at the National Employment Department.

New and renewed work permit - Each time when enterprises initially apply for the work permit of foreign workers for the first time at the Ministry of Labour, Human Resource Development and

Training and employ them for the first time, the work permit is considered as new. In case the foreigners move from the actual enterprise for another enterprise, the valid work permit is cancelled and again a new work permit rather than renewed work permit is issued. But in case of expiry of the current work permit and the foreign worker is still working for the same enterprise, the work permit is renewed. Applications should be submitted two months prior to the expiry of the current work permit. Applications for renewal of work permits received after expiry of current work permits is not accepted

Occupational Group - the National Classification of Occupations 2009 (NCO-09) adopted from International Standards Classification of Occupations 2008 (ISCO-08) which is a document of the International Labour Organisation (ILO) and is a tool for organising jobs in a clearly defined set of groups and according to the specificity of the tasks and duties undertaken in the job.

Placement - the offer of a decent and remunerative job/internship to a jobseeker.

Public Sector - It comprises of organisations that are owned and operated by Government and exist to provide services for its citizens.

Real Gross Domestic Product (GDP) Growth Rate - the rate of change that GDP at basic prices (amount receivable by the producer exclusive of taxes and inclusive of subsidies on products) changes/grows from one year to another after removing price effect. GDP is the aggregate money value of all goods and services produced within a country out of economic activity during a specified period, usually a year, before provision for the consumption of fixed capital.

Registered unemployed and in-employment at EIC - Only those persons who actively and continuously maintain their registration at EIC are included as registered. The live register comprises of new registrants, re-registrants and those maintaining their registration.

Reported - jobseekers who are maintaining their names on the live register of the National Employment Department.

Re-registrants - those who have ceased registration for a period not exceeding two years, and come back to be re-admitted on the live register. If the break is more than two years then the case will be considered as a new one.

Trainee Engineer Scheme (TES) – Government announced a special scheme in the Budget Programme 2016 – 2017. The scheme aimed at providing practical training for graduates in Engineering in order to

enable them to qualify for registration with the Council of Registered Professional Engineers (CRPE) of Mauritius and to operate as full-fledged Engineers.

Trainee Land Surveyor Scheme (TLSS) – Government announced in the 2023/2024 Budget, provides Diploma holders in Land Surveying from the University of Mauritius or equivalent qualifications with a two-year practical training under the supervision of a registered Land Surveyor, as required by the Land Surveyors Act, to qualify for registration as Land Surveyors.

Training and Placement of Persons with Disabilities (TPPD) – Government announced in the 2022/2023 Budget, aims to promote the inclusion of persons with disabilities in the open labour market in line with Article 27 of the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD).

Unemployment (Continuous Multi-Purpose Household Survey) - unemployment population comprise all Mauritians aged 16+ who are not working but who are looking for work and are available for work during the reference period.

Unemployed registered jobseekers at EIC - jobseekers aged 16 years and above registered as unemployed at EIC who are without work, currently available for work and actively seeking for work limited to Mauritian citizen residing in Mauritius and Rodrigues Island.

Unemployment rate - unemployment rate is the ratio (%) of unemployment to labour force.

Vacancy - a position in an enterprise that is vacant and a call for suitable candidate is being made.

Valid work permit - The non-citizens (Employment Restriction) Act 1973, stipulates that a non-citizen shall not engage in any occupation in Mauritius for reward or profit or be employed in Mauritius unless there is in force in relation to him a valid permit and he engages in the occupation, or is employed in accordance with any condition which may be specified in the permit. The Act also stipulates that “no person shall have a non-citizen in his employment in Mauritius without there being in force a valid permit in relation to that employment.”

Work Permit - a legal document authorising a person under certain conditions to take employment in Mauritius.

Workfare Programme - The Workfare Programme (WP) was initiated by Government to protect laid off workers in the difficult phase of their lives by providing them financial relief and assistance in

terms of job placement, training /re-skilling and starting up a business. It has been incorporated in the new Labour Laws under the Employment Rights Act 2008 and became effective following proclamation of the Act on 02 February 2009.

Youth Employment Programme (YEP) - a programme which started in 2013 for unemployed youth aged between 16 and 35 years and provides them with training and placement in an enterprise for an initial period of one year with the possibility of one additional year of placement with another enterprise. All youth should register first as unemployed at the EIC before applying at YEP.
